





**Last Game:** Having been named the WNBA's MVP earlier in the day, she demonstrated why by registering a double-double with 13 rebounds and 12 points in Game 1 vs. Atlanta, 9/22. Against the Dream, she added three assists, two steals and a blocked shot in 31+ minutes.

- Her two steals gave her 80 in her postseason career and she is the WNBA's all-time leader.
- She averaged 11.3 points and 7.7 rebounds per game in the first round series with New York, adding seven assists, six steals and one blocked shot in 33.7 minutes per game.
- To go along with a game-high eight boards and team-leading four assists, she scored 17 points and captured three steals in 35+ minutes without a turnover in Game 3 vs. New York, 9/19.
- Her eight rebounds featured four offensive boards, the most for any player on either team in the

series.

- On 1-8 from the floor, she scored a postseason career-low two points to go with a team-high nine rebounds and two assists in 28+ minutes of Game 2 at New York, 9/17.
- She had scored less than 10 points just five times in 32 previous playoff appearances.
- Until sitting out the season finale vs. Atlanta, she had played in 114 straight games, the second longest streak in franchise history.
- She shot 25-27 FT in her last five games and was seventh in the league with a career-high 88.3 percent from the line in the regular season.
- The only member of the Fever to lead the team in points, rebounds and assists in the same game, she did so three times, including the game at Chicago, 9/4, where she recorded 17 points, seven rebounds and a game-high six assists.
- Fourth in the WNBA with a team-high 162 free throw attempts, her 143 FTM were third most in the league.
- She blocked 19 shots in her last 16 games (1.19 bpg) and tied for 11th in the WNBA with an average of 0.91 bpg on the season.
- Against the Liberty, she was 17-19 from the foul line, setting Fever records for free throws made and attempted in a single game.
- With 43 steals in her last 22 games, she has become the WNBA's all-time career leader with 775 thefts in 10 seasons.

**Career & Personal Highlights**

- The first player in WNBA history with 5,000 points, 2,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists, she is the only player to rank in the league's all-time career top 10 in all three categories.
- Named an All-Star for the seventh time in her career in 2011, she received the most votes from the fans for the third time.
- Her one steal vs. New York, 8/3, was the 700th of her career and her assist in that game was the 1,000th of her career in the WNBA. She is the second player in league history with 700 thefts (708) in her career.
- Including 2010, she has finished among the top three in balloting for the WNBA MVP Award in five of her nine active pro seasons and has finished among the top five in MVP balloting in 8 of 9 active seasons

**Last Game:** In nearly 12 minutes of Game 1 vs. Atlanta, 9/22, she scored five points on 2-2 FG and 1-1 FT, adding two rebounds.

- The first player off the Indiana bench in Game 3 vs. New York, 9/19, she led the reserves with eight points on 3-4 FG and 2-2 FT. All eight points came in the second half, including four during Indiana's 13-2 run that helped seal the win. She also had three rebounds and a blocked shot in 13+ minutes vs. New York.
- In addition to her eight points on 4-5 FG, she claimed six rebounds in 18+ minutes of Game 2 at New York, 9/17.
- After having had no more than three rebounds in any of her first 15 playoff appearances, she has

had six or more in three of her last seven postseason outings.

- One of the leading candidates for the WNBA's Most Improved Player Award in 2011, she scored 20+ points three times this season, after having never scored more than 19 in her first four WNBA seasons.
- She shot 145-274 from the floor (.529) in 2011, fourth best in the league.
- In terms of field goal percentage, she has had three of the four best seasons in Fever franchise history.
- For the season, she averaged a career-high 10.7 ppg, 31st in the WNBA.
- She had multiple steals seven times in 2011, including her two against the Liberty in Game 1.
- She started the season by making just under 60 percent from the foul line (29-49, .592), but hit 39-48 FT (.813) in the last 19 games.
- She blocked multiple shots in 11 of the last 31 games and was fifth in the league with an average of 1.32 bpg.
- In her first start as a member of the Fever, she had nine points, three rebounds and a blocked shot in 20+ minutes vs. Connecticut, 6/25.
- She is one of just five players to ever have at least five blocked shots for the Fever and her six at Seattle, 6/17, matched Tammy Sutton-Brown's record set in 2008

**Career & Personal Highlights**

- She set a Fever franchise single-season record by hitting 57.1 percent from the floor (96-168 FG) in 2010.
- Averaging 7.4 ppg, she scored 10+ points 10 times last season.
- She averaged 9.5 ppg in the last 15 games
- Signed after a season-ending injury to Yolanda Griffith, she played in 26 games in 2009 and averaged 2.8 points, 1.5 rebounds and 0.54 blocks
- The No. 2 pick in the 2007 WNBA Draft, Davenport was signed by the Fever as a free agent four games into the 2009 regular season after being waived by the New York Liberty
- The first Ohio State player ever to don a Fever uniform, she joins Katie Douglas as former players of the year in the Big Ten Conference to play for the Fever
- After seeing limited minutes during the 2009 regular season, she sparked Indiana in the WNBA Finals by scoring in double figures twice, including a career-high 18 points in Game 5 at Phoenix.

**Last Game:** Ending a run of four straight games with 20+ points, she shot just 3-12 FG, 1-5 3-pt FG and 4-4 FT for her 11 points in Game 1 vs. Atlanta, 9/22. She added a team-high tying three assists, five rebounds and one steal vs. the Dream.

- She led the Fever with 21 points on 7-15 FG, 2-5 3-pt FG and 5-6 FT in Game 3 vs. New York, 9/19. She added four rebounds, two assists, a steal and a blocked shot in 35+ minutes against the Liberty.
- With her first 3-pt FG in Game 3, she became the fourth player in WNBA history to make 75 3-pt FG in her playoff career.
- She tallied a game-high 20 points to go with three assists and a rebound in 28+ minutes of Game 2

at New York, 9/17.

- She has scored 10+ points in the last 11 games and averaged 18.0 ppg in that span.
- In the last 11 games, she has had 31 assists and 10 steals.
- Her five 3-pt FG vs. Atlanta, 9/11, gave her 66 on the season, fourth best in the WNBA. She has made at least 66 3-pt FG in each of the last three seasons.
- She was fourth in the league with a mark of 44.0 percent from beyond the 3-pt arc.
- With her steal and two assists vs. Tulsa, 6/14, she became the fourth player in WNBA history with 850 assists and 500 steals in her career.
- She was the first player in league history to have both 500 steals and 500 3-pt FG in her career.
- Ending the first week of the season as the WNBA's leading scorer with an average of 21.0 ppg, she was named the Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the week ending June 12.

**Career & Personal Highlights**

- She comes into the 2011 playoffs with 129 career postseason assists and 60 steals, both are eighth most in league history.
- She is the only player in league history with 500 steals and 500 3-pt FG and she is one of four players with 500+ steals and 850+ assists in her career.
- Ensuring that she will finish her WNBA career with her hometown team, she signed a contract extension with the Fever on August 12, 2010.
- A three-time WNBA All-Star, three-time All-WNBA selection and a three-time member of the WNBA's All-Defensive Team, she has just finished her third summer in her hometown of Indianapolis
- In her first two seasons with the Fever, she became one of six 1,000-point scorers in franchise history

**Last Game:** Due to a coaching decision, she did not play in Game 1 vs. Atlanta, 9/22.

- Making her first appearance in the playoffs for the Fever, she recorded her first ever postseason steal and was scoreless (0-2 FG) in six minutes at New York, 9/17.
- Ending a run of 30 straight appearances, she did not play, due to a coaching decision, in Game 1 vs. New York, 9/15.
- She had no blocked shots in her first 16 appearances, but had at least one in five of the last 17 games, totaling six rejections in that span.
- Coming in for an injured Erin Phillips, she played just the last 3:34 of the game and led the Indiana bench with seven points on 1-1 FG and 5-5 FT vs. Washington, 9/7. She also had a team-high tying two offensive rebounds against the Mystics.

She had a season-high two offensive rebounds five times this season, including two of her last five games.

- Since a three-game span in late July and early August in which she was 8-13 from the floor, she shot 11-38 FG in the last 12 games.

- She has a degree in retail and consumer science and started her own fashion consulting company, Styles by Ms. Ely
- She was named the 2001 Naismith Prep Player of the Year and the USA Today National Player of the Year following her senior year at Ben Davis High School

- Phillips scored a career-best 21 points in each of the Fever's previous two appearances in Atlanta.
- Coming within one steal of a franchise playoff record, she had a career-high five thefts to accompany 12 points, three rebounds, three assists and a blocked shot in nearly 35 minutes (34:45) of Game 3, 9/19.

**Last Game:** She led the Fever to its first victory over the Atlanta Dream in 2011 with a postseason career-high 25 points that featured 5-7 from 3-pt range at Conseco Fieldhouse, 9/22. She also had nine rebounds, two assists, one steal and a playoff career-high tying four blocked shots.

- Her five 3-pt FG in Game 1 vs. the Dream are a franchise playoff record and she scored 20+ points in a postseason game for the first time since 2004.
- With those four blocked shots, she has 58 in her postseason career, fourth on the WNBA's all-time list, and just one behind the late Margo Dydek.
- To accompany two blocked shots and seven points, she had seven rebounds and an assist in 30+ minutes of Game 3 vs. the Liberty, 9/19.

- Her nine boards gave her 296 in her postseason career, sixth on the WNBA's all-time career list.
- Including the 50th 3-pt FG of her postseason career, she scored seven points and collected five rebounds with two assists and three steals in 24 minutes of Game 2 at New York, 9/17.
- In addition to four rebounds and seven points, she had two assists and a steal in 32 minutes of Game 1 vs. New York, 9/15.
- After going 0-6 from the floor at Connecticut, 9/2, she shot 15-26 FG in the last four games, including 5-8 from 3-pt range. In those four games, she averaged 9.3 mpg.
- Her first three points in the season finale against the Dream, 9/11, gave her 5,000 in her career and she is the eighth player in WNBA history to reach that plateau.
- After not having more than one blocked shot in her first 29 appearances, she had two rejections in two of the last four games and had at least one in a season-high four straight games to conclude the season.
- She had six blocks in the last four games, after having nine in her previous 29 appearances.
- She averaged 1.65 apg in her last 26 games, after totaling just six assists in her first seven games.
- She has shot nearly 88 percent from the foul line this season, but is not ranked among the league leaders due to a lack of attempts (28-32).
- She recorded 20 steals in her last 26 games, compared to just two in her first seven appearances.
- Her first 3-pt FG against the Sky, 6/4, was the 200th of her career and she joins Seattle's Lauren Jackson as the only players in WNBA history with 200 3-pt FG and 500 blocked shots in their careers.

**Last Game:** In addition to a 2011-high eight rebounds, she had 10 points, two blocked shots and two assists in 32+ minutes of Game 1 vs. Atlanta, 9/22.

- She has averaged 8.8 ppg and shot 9-21 FG (.429) with 17-18 FT in four playoff games in 2011.
- She had two steals, three points, two blocked shots and seven rebounds in 36 minutes vs. New York in Game 3, 9/19.
- Two steals tied her most ever in the postseason. She has had two steals five times in her postseason career, including three times in the last two years against the Liberty.
